Applications are invited for a 1-year, full-time leave coverage position of Lecturer and Coordinator, Office of Experiential Education (OEE), Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences, UBC.

The successful applicant will primarily work with the Director, OEE to coordinate PHRM 371, an Introductory Pharmacy Practice Experiences (IPPE) practicum course for the Entry-to-Practice PharmD Program; coordinate and contribute to the development and delivery of practice educator education, onboarding and training; sustain and build placement capacity for experiential education; provide support to students and practice educators; and pursue scholarship and research activities in experiential education.

Additional administrative and teaching responsibilities include the following:

- Contribute to the coordination and ongoing refinement of the Introductory Pharmacy Practice Experiences (IPPE) practicum courses
- Ensure course materials and activities are reflective of current and future pharmacy practice and guidelines and actively engage students in meaningful learning experiences
- Apply best practices and continuous quality improvement for practicum course development and delivery
- Serve as a liaison to practice sites in matters pertaining to student placements
- Participate in student learning activities and progress, providing feedback to students and other stakeholders as necessary
- Contribute to the design and delivery of practice educator development programs and enhancement of practice educator recognition
- Identify, select, and modify instructional resources to meet the needs of the students
- Assist in assessing changing curricular needs and offer plans for improvement
- Supervise/co-supervise graduate or undergraduate students for any project or course-related work
- Communicate effectively, both orally and in writing, with students, Faculty, staff and other professionals
- Increase the profile of the OEE within the pharmacy community
- Perform other related functions as required by the Director, OEE

The successful candidate will be expected to participate in the academic life and teach/supervise learners in the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences. He/she will be an innovative teacher who will integrate technologies and new approaches to learning into our curriculum. The successful individual should possess exceptional communication and problem solving skills, be able to work effectively and contribute within a team environment, and maintain positive working relationships with a variety of stakeholders. Preference will be given to an individual with current and active experience in precepting, coaching and mentoring students.

Applicants must have a Bachelor's degree in Pharmacy or a PharmD. and must be eligible for licensure in British Columbia. Completion of an accredited pharmacy practice residency or post-graduate PharmD is an asset. Salary is negotiable, commensurate with experience and is subject to final budgetary approval. Applications, including a letter of application, curriculum vitae and the contact information of three references must be submitted online (www.facultycareers.ubc.ca/31521). Review of applications will begin on November 5th, 2018 however, applications will continue to be accepted until the position has been filled.
