

***Clinical Lecturer, School of Pharmacy, University of Waterloo***

The School of Pharmacy in the Faculty of Science at the University of Waterloo invites applications for an individual with a strong background in hospital pharmacy practice and exceptional teaching skills for a full-time clinical lecturer position with an anticipated start date of October 1, 2018. The successful candidate will have prior experience teaching pharmacy students at the university level, a minimum of 5 years of practice experience, ideally in a hospital or institutional setting, and expertise in an area of clinical practice such as (but not limited to) infectious diseases, mental health or critical care medicine. Teaching in the undergraduate curriculum in areas related to hospital pharmacy and clinical practice is expected. In addition, the successful candidate will engage in service activities in support of the school, university or pharmacy profession as well as collaborate on research projects.

The ideal candidate will have a BSc in Pharmacy or PharmD from an accredited program of study and be licensed or eligible for licensure with the Ontario College of Pharmacists. Excellent communication and organization skills together with a strong commitment to teaching are essential.

The salary range for this position is \$100,000 to \$125,000 annually. While the initial appointment is for a five year definite term, the appointed lecturer may be considered for promotion to an on-going appointment thereafter as Continuing Clinical Lecturer.

The Health Sciences Campus is also home to a regional program of McMaster University's Michael G.
