INTRODUCTION

- ▶ The Blueprint for Pharmacy Implementation Plan has a number of actions and deliverables grouped into five key areas. These actions are re-grouped into ten projects required to change pharmacy practice
- PROJECT 1: Core Pharmacy Curriculum
  - 1.1 Ensure that core pharmacy curricula address the knowledge, skills and values required for future pharmacy practice to ensure new graduates are prepared to develop and practise in emerging roles.
  - 1.5 Increase the accessibility, quality, quantity and variety of experiential learning opportunities to prepare pharmacy professionals, including students, to practise in expanded and innovative roles.
  - 1.11 Conduct and <u>utilize research to develop, evaluate and improve</u> education and continuing professional development (CPD) programs.

1.1 Ensure that core pharmacy curricula address the knowledge, skills and values required for future pharmacy practice to ensure new graduates are prepared to develop and practise in emerging roles.



#### Our Pharm.D. is a Competency-based program

- Not solely focussed on knowledge acquisition, but on its usage to resolve complex problems
- We had to develop a set of competencies for future pharmacists in 2005. These competencies are generally in line with those proposed to AFPC by a consulting group in 2010.

- Communication

- Pharmaceutical care

#### Our Pharm.D. is a Centered on experiential learning

- Each of our 200 students will undergo 40 weeks of clerkships
  - 20 weeks in community pharmacies
  - 16 weeks in hospital pharmacies (75% in University and affiliated hospitals)
  - 4 weeks in a novel area to expand experience and eventually scope of practice
- Clerkships start early
  - 4 weeks after the first year (community)
  - 4 weeks after the second year (hospital)
  - 32 weeks in the fourth year
- We rely on a pool of >1200 trained preceptors
