The College of Pharmacy, Rady Faculty of Health Sciences (RFHS), University of Manitoba, Canada invites applications for a full-time, term position of up to three years, with opportunity for renewal, at the rank of Instructor I/II/senior, commencing June 01, 2023, or at a time to be negotiated. Salary and rank will be commensurate with experience and qualifications, and in accordance with the University of Manitoba Faculty Association collective agreement.

The successful candidate will teach in the College of Pharmacy academic programs, primarily in the undergraduate Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) courses. Duties will include teaching and coordination in the Pharmaceutical Sciences stream of courses, and creating and implementing compounding, pharmaceutics and drug-delivery laboratories. Other duties may include facilitating and participating in any relevant interprofessional education. The position also requires service to the College of Pharmacy, Rady Faculty of Health Sciences, University of Manitoba, the profession, and the community as appropriate.

The successful candidate will possess a BSc (Pharm) or PharmD degree with significant and relevant teaching or practice experience. Preference will be given to applicants with additional MSc (Pharm) or PhD training in the area of Pharmaceutical Sciences. The candidate must have excellent organizational, communication, and interpersonal teamwork skills. The candidate must have a knowledge of common computer software programs and a working knowledge of instrumentation associated with the pharmaceutical sciences area. In addition to in-person teaching responsibilities, ability to teach in a virtual on-line environment is an asset.
