The Leslie Dan Faculty of Pharmacy (LDFP) at the University of Toronto invites applications for a full-time teaching stream appointment at the rank of Assistant Professor, Teaching Stream in the area of Pharmacy, with an anticipated start date of July 1, 2023.

We seek enthusiastic and innovative candidates whose expertise and interests in teaching will readily build connections between basic sciences and clinical practice. To complement our current departmental strengths, we are especially seeking candidates with strength, in the following: experiential education, community pharmacy or primary care innovation in practice, program evaluation. Candidates must have a record of excellence in teaching in a degree-granting program/post-secondary institution, including lecture preparation and delivery, curriculum development, and development and implementation of online methods. Additionally, candidates must provide evidence of capacity for teaching-related scholarship, be intellectually curious, and committed to pursue novel and innovative methods of thinking, teaching, and pedagogical enquiry. Candidates should demonstrate the administrative, organizational, and mentoring skills required to coordinate large-size classes, experiential education and the skills necessary to work collaboratively with all members of the department.

Applicants must have completed both a PharmD and graduate degree in health sciences oriented field OR have completed a Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy degree as well as an equivalent research-oriented PhD in a health sciences oriented field by the time of appointment. All applicants must have a minimum of five years of professional practice experience or teaching experience in a degree granting program/post-secondary institution. Completion of at least a 1-year hospital or ambulatory care pharmacy residency is an asset.

Candidates must provide evidence of excellence in teaching and a commitment to excellent pedagogical inquiry. This will be demonstrated by the application material described below that clearly outlines and presents the candidate's teaching-related accomplishments, philosophy, awards and accolades, and presentations at significant conferences. Applicants must submit a teaching portfolio that includes a teaching statement highlighting philosophy, and previous experience (that may include small and large class formats, online teaching, student mentorship, examples of collaborative approaches to teaching, and involvement in experiential education). The teaching statement should also highlight the applicant's capacity to contribute to the LDFP excellence in educational scholarship that may include sample course syllabi (either of courses delivered by the candidate or planned for the future), course evaluations; and samples of recent teaching-related scholarly work related to the position; as well as strong letters of reference from referees of high standing that specifically highlight the candidate's teaching abilities.

Equity and diversity are essential to academic excellence. We seek candidates who value diversity and whose teaching-related scholarship, teaching and service are aligned with our commitment to equity. Candidates are therefore asked to include a statement discussing past, current and/or planned contributions to equity and diversity, which might cover topics such as (but not limited to): research or teaching that incorporates a focus on underrepresented communities, the development of inclusive



pedagogies, public engagement activities that reach out to marginalized communities, and mentoring of students from underrepresented groups.

Salary to be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

- A teaching portfolio to include a teaching statement (outlined above; 3-page limit), sample course syllabi and course evaluations

Applicants, however, remain responsible for ensuring that referees submit letters (on letterhead, dated and signed) by the closing date.
